ACADEMICS

Phonics:

Introduce and instruct vowels – (a, e, i, o, u), alphabet, and letter sounds Recognizing colors -- red, blue, & green

Instruct – on the letter li

Language Enrichment: Kindergarten Poems – "The Little Turtle" with motions. Writing:

Instruct on how to write and hold a pencil. Learn to slant papers and prepare children for writing in cursive.

Numbers:

Counting from 1 - 10 Introduce & recognizing numbers 1 - 6

Recognizing patterns (example – red, blue, red, blue. The next color should be? <u>red</u>) Introduce concept of same/different (ex: I have 2 circles & 1 square, which two are the same? : <u>circle</u>, different? <u>square</u>)

BIBLE: God Made the World. This week's Memory Verses: Genesis 1:1-19 NKJV "The earth is the Lord's and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell therein." Psalm 24:1 Letter A: "All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." Rom 3:23
